



VEEP high points:

- An electrical training ALLIANCE sponsored, directed, and approved Pre-Apprenticeship program – Meeting Direct Entry Allowance in Standards for Accepting JATCs
- Supporting Active duty or recently separated Military Veterans and Spouses from all branches
- No Cost to Participant Pre-Apprenticeship Program
- Provides Direct Entry path for program graduate into Registered Apprenticeship
- Candidates designate top three “home base locations” and the etA works to get them accepted in the top available choice of receiving location
- The Inside 1st Year Curriculum, plus Building a Foundation in Mathematics Level I, plus a Craft Certification performance evaluation is the basis of the pre-apprenticeship
- First Aid/CPR, OSHA-10, and other additions can be discussed
- Bases that utilize the opportunity must have a Career Skills Program (CSP) agreement – or similar depending on branch of military – These agreements are with the VEEP program, not the local JATC – etA to facilitate
- Accepting JATC’s must have 2011 or Newer (Current) Standards and agree to accept direct entry graduate in order for them to participate at all
- Training JATC’s might or might not have participants that choose the training location as their final destination
- Focus is on service members in their final 180 days prior to separation
- This is different than the VICE model
- etA is the sponsor of the pre-apprenticeship program, delivery of content is by the training JATC
- Expectations are that a participant will follow local policies administered locally
- Participants are not registered apprentices.



etA responsibilities

- Communicate with JATC's, training and accepting
- Coordinate with H2H
- Facilitate CSP agreement (or the like) being implemented - avoid parallel efforts by local JATC's
- Coordinate assignment to receiving JATC's, honoring the preferred order specified by candidates
- Provide any requested guidance in setting up a course syllabus
- Support training by mitigating cost impacts
- Coordinate with training partner to make graduation memorable
- Serves as conduit for records from training JATC to receiving JATC
- Retains records for annual reporting on applications



Training JATC deliverables

- Set up and administer recruitment activities on base
- Process applications
- Turn over Application folders for graduates
 - Applications-
 - Aptitude test results
- Retain and turn over application logs
- Provide curriculum outline
- Provide Statement of completion
- Be an information conduit-
 - Provide Information as requested by accepting JATC's from participants
 - Provide Information from accepting JATC's as requested by participants
- Graduation event planning, coordinated with program sponsors etA and Milwaukee.

Training JATC receives

- Milwaukee sponsor gifts to program
- Video recognition of all efforts and participation to be shared with entire IBEW/NECA industry
- Recognition in local media for service
- Recognition from the military branch for supporting the service
- Stronger relationship with military base personnel
